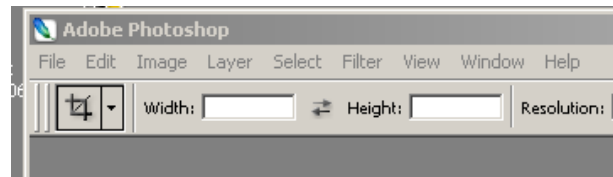


Resizing a photo using "Save For Web" in Photoshop

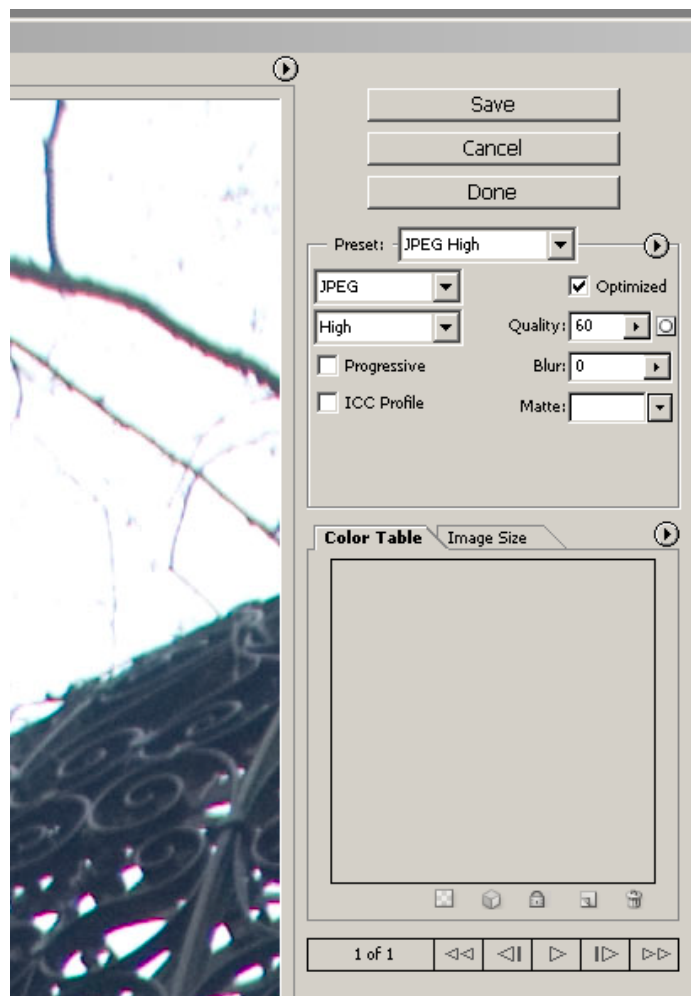

1. Open your photo in Photoshop.
2. Left click on File in main toolbar.
3. Click on "Save for Web" in drop-down menu. If there is a size warning ignore it and click "OK".



Don't be concerned if the image is oversized and doesn't fit the window.

4. In "Preset" window, make sure "JPEG High" is selected. If not click on arrow on right of "Preset" window and select "JPEG high".
5. Click on "Image Size".

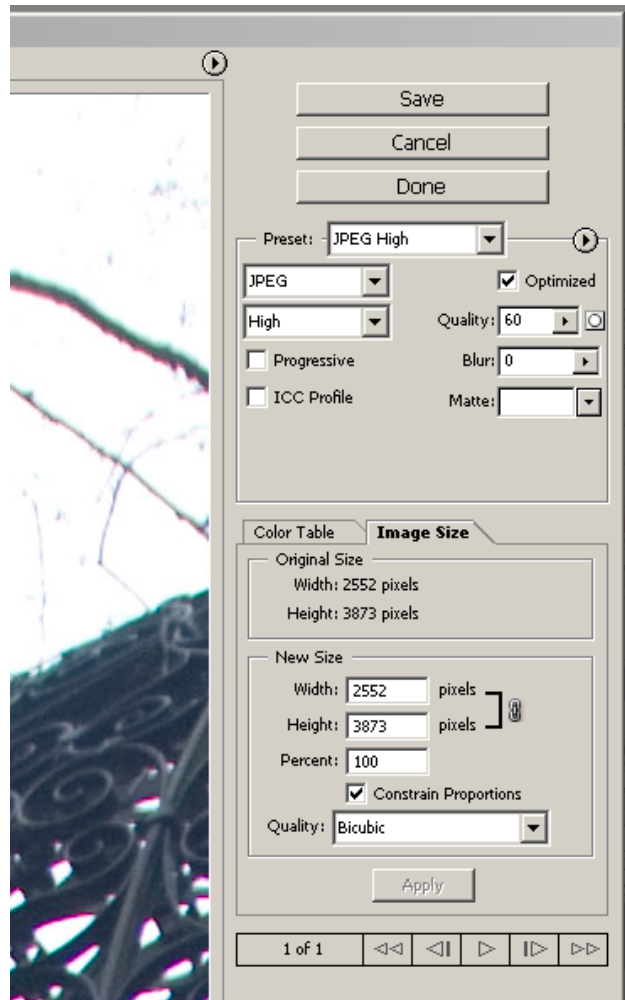


6. In "New Size" window, make sure that "Constrain Proportions" is checked.

7. Select largest size (in this case 3873 pixels) and change to 750 pixels. The second dimension will automatically be changed.

8. Click on Apply. Your image should come down to size on your screen.

9. Click on "Save..



10. Name your image in "File name" keeping name to 21 characters or less. Do not use any special characters in the name, such as \ / : * ? " < > ,

11. Make sure "Save as type" indicates a "*.jpg" file.

12. In "Save in" box, show the folder you want to save the file in.

13. The process is complete when you click on "Save" on lower right.
